WPICA Elections this October

Vice President - Oversee administrative affairs of the Association. Directly supervise all committees and assist, when required, with interfacing with elected officials, state and county authorities, and area businesses. Serving in this capacity will require you to attend quarterly Board of Governor meetings that last 60 minutes, semi-annual Community Association meetings which last 90 minutes, and devote a couple of hours each month to coordinate issues within WPICA.

Secretary – Execute administrative duties of the Association and record minutes of all meetings. Serving in this capacity will require you to attend quarterly Board of Governor meetings which last 60 minutes, and semi-annual Community Association meetings which last 90 minutes.

Treasurer – Coordinates all financial matters of the Association. Serving in this capacity will require you to attend quarterly Board of Governor meetings that last 60 minutes, semi-annual Community Association meetings which last 90 minutes, and devote a couple of hours each month to coordinate issues within WPICA.

Sergeant at Arms – Serving in this office will require you to attend quarterly Board of Governor meetings that last 90 minutes. At semi-annual Community Association meetings, you will be expected to help arrange the room and equipment, greet all members and guests, record meeting attendance, and help return the room to a normal condition. Other duties include reminding WPICA Board of upcoming meeting, and collecting and tallying ballots if a secret ballot is requested by a majority at a meeting.

Board of Governors - Serve on the Executive body to guide the direction of the Association and approve purchases and payments essential to WPICA functions. Serving in this capacity will require you to attend quarterly Board of Governor meetings which last 60 minutes, and semi-annual Community Association meetings which last 90 minutes.

In addition to the offices listed above, WPICA needs volunteers in the following areas:

- Volunteers are needed to augment **Citizens on Patrol**. Help patrol the streets of Westview Park. WPICA will provide a sign for your vehicle and a radio to communicate any disturbances to 2nd Precinct police officers. Contact Jackie Lynam at (410) 788-8969.

Election Process

- Call for “nominations” and “seconds” from the floor
 - Person must have dues paid and live within the Westview Park boundaries
- Call for a “motion” and “second” to close nominations
 - “Unless there are any objections, nominations are closed.”
- In those offices that are uncontested, if any:
 - “Uncontested candidates are elected by acclamation.”
- If an office is contested:
 - Candidates go to the foyer
 - Call for votes by hand; secret ballot to occur, only if a majority of residents desires a secret ballot
